The aim of the gourd art competition is to encourage artists of all levels of experience to challenge themselves to create a piece of gourd art which fits the particular category described in show schedule.

Each year a number of the categories are changed in order to encourage the use of new techniques, ideas or materials. I was disappointed to see so few entries in the children and youth categories. I'm sure there are



young gourders in many patches and gourd families. Remember, they are our next "crop" of gourd artists!

Please consider sponsoring their efforts to enter the free competition by assisting with entry forms, mailing or carry their gourd art to and from the show. It is understandable that some individuals are somewhat intimidated by the prospect of being judged on the results of their efforts. However, this competition and the judging process is very much aimed at supporting the artists' attempts to successfully comply with the requirements of the category entered. It is essential that category descriptions be read carefully. Through competitions you can grow and improve your gourd crafting abilities and enhance your reputation as a gourd artist. Most of all entering a competition affords you the opportunity to challenge yourself and experience the personal satisfaction of winning an award or at least knowing that you have made an honest attempt to compete. I would like to challenge each member of the California Gourd Society to enter one or more pieces in next year's competition. I know each of you could use your talents to create at least one piece. I'll see you at the show!

The C.G.S. Iron Gourd Art Competition returns to the Welburn Gourd

Farm in De Luz Canyon, CA for the 6th Annual Gourd and Pumpkin Festival.

A new year, a new challenge!

As you may already know, we did change the competition format this year. This was done for several reasons not only to **challenge the artist**, but also to give them more opportunity to interact with spectators and enjoy the festival without becoming *exhausted*.

SO... this year we will feature collaborative *TEAMS*. Two artists working together will create a winning gourd in just 6 hours. Starting at 9 a.m. participants will select one or more gourds from the pile generously donated by Welburn Gourd Farms and begin the creative process. Artists using more than one gourd must produce a single unified piece of art. Work will stop at 3 p.m.

All entries will be judged by a qualified artist.

The \$500 "Grand Prize" will be awarded to and shared by the winning creators of the creation which most closely fits the judging criteria. Here are the criteria:

Impact on the viewer 35%, Composition and arrangement of elements 35%, Technical Quality 20% and Workmanship 10%.

A winner for the "*People's Choice*" Award of merchandise and / or gift certificates will be determined by the number of "ballots" cast by visitors who have purchased tickets (\$1 per ticket) and dropped in the box at the artists' work stations as they are working.

Announcement of winners will take place following the judging which begins at 3 p.m. At that time the Grand Prize and People's Choice Awards will be presented. The grand finale will be the raffle of each finished gourd by drawing a ticket from the ballot box of each artist. The one exception is that the "Grand Prize" winning piece will be auctioned off to the highest bidder.

We already have several past participants forming teams. Angela Briggs and Betsy Roberts will team up as "The Sisters" as well as Darlene Propp teaming up with her patch mate Carol Brown. I've heard *rumors* of Paul and Kathy Klopfenstein teaming up, as well as a team from the OC Patch. Any other patches out there? We hope Daniel Montano will be back defending his title as well as all of our other past participants! **Take up the challenge!** Form your team and send in your entry fee right away! Team members must be members of the California Gourd Society. There is a \$50.00 entry fee per team. The fee is payable to C.G.S. by October 10th and should be sent to Jill Walker (905 W. Linden Rd., Watsonville, CA 95076 Teams will be provided a covered work space as well as electricity for their power tools.

If you're not up for the challenge this year there are other ways you can participate: Volunteers are needed to sell raffle tickets throughout the day. If you can help for an hour or more, please send your name to Jill Walker at prezwalker@hotmail.com

Come join the fun. You can watch these true competitors do their stuff and learn new tricks and techniques. There well be vendors to visit in the festival grounds, gourd classes and loads of wonderful Welburn gourds to buy.

Hawaii's First Festival By Betty Finch

The Hawaii Gourd Society hosted their first Gourd Festival the third weekend of June at the Kona Pavilion by the sea. Launched with grand style, the event was attended by gourd enthusiasts from Alabama, California, Indiana, Oregon, and South Carolina.

The festivities began with a potluck at the gourd farm where one could dine on butter avocados the size of melons while watching antics of colorful parrots against the backdrop of the ocean and a rainforest canopy tree house.

Vendors were greeted at the festival pavilion with a fresh flower lei. Pavilion activities included an interesting variety of musical entertainment, palm frond hat weavers, gourd vendors, classes, a tasty dinner, and much visiting.

Many of the Hawaiian artists displayed gourds decorated with the Ni'hau gourd decorating technique. Named after the island where the method was first used, the technique involves etching a design in the skin of a green gourd and filling the gourd with coffee to stain the wood from the inside.

A highlight of the festival was when American Gourd Society President, Bob James, presented Mary Amos with the Hawaii Gourd Society Charter.

Mary Amos and Evie Morby were the driving force behind the Hawaii festival. Their enthusiasm was contagious. Evie was carrying a state-of-the art laptop computer which she used to photograph and record everything as it happened. Mary and Evie are already working on the January 10-13, 2008 festival being held at the same location Kailua-Kona, HI Hale Halewai Pavilion . Interested in attending? Robert Rivera Interview by Carol Rookstool

Carol Rookstool, founding president of CGS interviewed Robert Rivera to learn about his latest work.

Raised in Fallbrook, California, Robert has been a frequent participant in CGS events over the past 12 years. Now we catch up on his news.

Carol: I understand that your new book is available.

Robert: Yes, the special edition is nearly sold out and the

new paperback is available this week. I am very excited about the great pictures in this book.

Carol: What prompted you to take time from your busy schedule to prepare a new book?

Robert: I have so many friends throughout the US that this seemed the best way to share my new work. I could talk for hours and hours about the things that inspire me but there is nothing better than photographs to illustrate the creative spirit that drives me. I also like to sign each book because it makes this a very personal communication between me and those who love gourd art like I do.

Carol: Do you sketch your concepts in advance or do you work out your ideas directly on gourds?

Robert: I don't seem to need sketches because I can visualize the finished project in my mind. Usually I plan a series based on a theme or object. Then I get into the creative process directly on a gourd. The quality of the materials I am using is important to me and I like to work directly with the media. As you know, I have invented several compounds to create some of the surfaces for my art. But all this dabbling in new materials and taking photographs pulls me away from the studio.

Carol: As an artist, how much time do you spend in the studio each day?

Robert: Not enough! There are so many distractions and I love to spend time with my kids and my wife, Linda. Traveling to galleries and shows also pulls me away from the studio. We do set Sundays aside for re-energizing but even then I can't help thinking about gourds!!


