Festival Re-Cap SECOND ANNUAL DAVIS RANCH GOURD FESTIVAL

The Second Annual Davis Ranch Gourd Festival in the beautiful countryside of Sloughhouse, CA. was a lot of fun. Sloughhouse is famous for its corn and attracts a large following. So there are lots of people coming to the Festival that really don't know about gourds. They came to buy corn and stayed to see and buy gourds. CGS volunteers did demonstrations both days of the festival, from "How to Clean" a gourd to "History of Gourds". There were many patches represented and great vendors and individual booths – all under a large tent that





protected us from the quick rainstorm on Saturday. Mostly the weather was delightful.

Sloughhouse has been growing gourds for three years now and had great sale prices. Admission to the festival was free along with free parking. There was multi-cultural entertainment all through the festival, from Hawaiian dancers to gourd percussion artist. There was also a corn maze, the large green market selling corn and other vegetables and a seasonal pumpkin patch. Plus a petting zoo and pony rides for kids. Everyone had FUN! There were also pre-festival gourd art classes on Friday.

The Second Annual Gourd Festival at Davis/ Sloughhouse (near Sacramento) in September was lots of fun (and work!). CGS members provided demonstrations for cutting and cleaning gourds, beading on gourds, dot painting, faux turquoise, decoupaging the inside of a gourd, knotless netting, pine needle weaving and a short "history of gourds". My thanks to all the demonstrators. Additionally, CGS had a booth where we provided



information on our Society and on gourds and sold some of Larry McClelland's gourds. We renewed several memberships and signed up two new members. It is always fun to share gourd information with new members.

I have had the pleasure of officially visiting still more "Patches". The San Francisco East Bay Gourd Patch was brand new to me. They had a great meeting where they explored various coloring techniques. Everyone in the group shared ideas and materials including ink dyes, transparent acrylics, wood dyes, and powder pigments. Various members brought their special "coloring" technique, explained a little about how they use various materials and invited the rest of the group to try their hand. I had a chance to try the new transparent acrylics. And I also had the chance to meet some wonderful people. I raffled off one of Larry Mac's gourds and a few other small items (look for that when I visit your "Patch"). So far, Patch visiting is my favorite activity of being President. I also raffled off one of Larry's gourd at one of my regular patch groups, the Z Miner Folsom/Sacramento Patch. The Z Miners are a large, busy group and lots of fun to be involved with.

At every "Patch" I visit I ask for and receive some great suggestions about the future of California Gourd Society. As the year ends, CGS is already planning 2011. What do you want to see happen? Call to Artists

Third Annual Northern California Gourd Art Competition – 2011

A Northern CA CGS Gourd Art Competition will take place at Leiser Farms 9^{th} Annual Gourd Festival in Knights Landing, California May $14^{th} - 15^{th}$. It is open to all CGS members throughout the state and beyond.

There are three divisions: Please note: The children's competition will be handled by the local elementary school.

The Novice division is for members who have not previously won a ribbon (Honor system) in a CGS competition. *The Open division* is for anyone who has won a ribbon in the novice division or who do not consider themselves a beginner.

The Masters division is for artists who have achieved a level of expertise as demonstrated by having won awards, had work published or sold work in galleries. Artist entering specific categories in the Master's division may not enter the same category in the Open Division, but may enter other Open Division categories.

HOW TO ENTER

* The entry fee is \$6.00 for each entry. Make checks payable to CGS. Advance registration is not taken.

* All work must be original and done by the exhibiting artist and not previously entered in any CGS competition. Gourds must predominate and artistry, originality and integrity of design are all important.

- * Only one piece per category is permitted.
- * Entries may be submitted on Thursday, May 12th, from 12 noon 5 pm or Friday, May 13th, 8 am 9 am.
- * NO MAILED ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- * Judging will take place on Friday, May 13th and the display will be open for viewing on Saturday and Sunday.

* Release and pick up of entries will be from 3-5 pm on Sunday, May 15th. All art work not picked up will become the property of CGS.

* While every effort is made to provide security of items, Leiser Farms and the California Gourd Society are not responsible for damage or lost items.

* It is the responsibility of the artists to place their piece in the correct category. Please read category descriptions carefully.

Open and Novice Divisions—Categories 1-10

Musical instruments: Instrument must be playable. Category 1: Category 2: Carving: Whole or cut gourd. Carving must be featured. Natural or clear finish only. Category 3: Pyrography: Wood burned only. Natural or clear finish only. Mix media: Any technique allowed. On entry form please indicate materials used. Category 4: Category 5: Weaving: Gourd with weaving of natural or man-made materials. You must be able to see some of the gourd. Category 6: Coiling: Natural or man-made materials. Category 7: Masks: Whole or cut gourds. Any technique allowed. Must include a sturdy hanger so it can be hung. Category 8: Jewelry: Any technique allowed May use additional materials/embellishments. Category 9: Native American - including North Coast Indians. Category 10: Fantasy: Anything goes Masters Division -Categories 1& 2

Artist entering specific categories in the Master's division may not enter the same category in the Open Division, but may enter other Open Division categories.

Category 1: Pyrography. Wood burn only with natural or clear finish only.

Category 2: Free Style – anything goes

CALL TO ARTISTS

The final Competition at Welburn Gourd Festival will be held at Welburn Farms June 25th and 26th, 2011. It is open to all CGS members throughout the state and beyond. The purpose of the Gourd Art Competition is to challenge CGS members to create new art and develop new ideas for gourd art which fulfills the requirements of a show category. Thousands of visitors attend the exhibit each year and enjoy the creativity and skill of CGS members. This year will be the last Competition at Welburn Festival – Let's make it the best one ever! Start working now!

2011 California Gourd Art Competition Rules:

Any individual may enter. All entrants must be current members of the California Gourd Society. Children and youth are also eligible to enter any novice category. Artist entering specific categories in the Master's division may not enter the same category in the Open Division, but may enter other Open Division categories.

GOURDS MUST PREDOMINATE – artistry, originality and integrity of design are considered. Participants many enter any division, only one piece per category.

There are five divisions:

- The *Novice division* is for members who have not previously won a ribbon in a CGS competition.
- The *Open Division* is for anyone who has won a ribbon in the novice division or who does not consider themselves a beginner (honor system).
- The *Master's Division* includes artist who have achieved a level of expertise as demonstrated by having won awards, had work published and/or sold work in galleries.
- The *Children's division* includes anyone 12 years of age or younger.
- The Youth division includes 13-17 year olds.

The entry fee is \$6.00 for each entry. **Make checks payable to CGS**. There is no charge for children and youth. All work must be done by the exhibiting artist and not previously entered in any CGS competition. Advance registration is not taken. When mailing entries, please include a completed entry form for each entry as well as the \$6.00 entry fee and return postage if needed.

Deadline: Mailed entries must be postmarked no later than Monday, June 20th. Mail to CGS c/o Welburn Gourd Farm, 40635 De Luz Road, Fallbrook, CA 92028.

Personal deliveries may be delivered to Welburn only on Thursday June 23rd between 9 am and 4pm. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE JUDGED!

Judging will take place on Thursday and Friday, June 23rd and 24th. All participants agree to allow photographs to be taken of displayed items.

Pick-up will be on Sunday, June 26th between 3:00 and 5:00 p.m. Entries may not be removed early. Mailed entries will be returned within two weeks after the show. Mailed entries must have return postage and self addressed shipping container with a label. All art work not picked up or arranged for pre-paid return will be donated to CGS.

Judging: The California Gourd Society will coordinate all judging. Judging will follow the American Gourd Society judging guidelines.

While every effort is made to provide security for your items, the Welburn Gourd Farm and the California Gourd Society are not responsible for damaged or lost items.



It is so interesting to have watched the growth over the years, and each time there is a gourd event, it is a fascinating surprise to see the new directions that gourd art is taking. The quality and the diversity of work produced today has at last encouraged the publishers of Lark Books to include an addition to their highly acclaimed "500" series, this one devoted exclusively to gourds.

Unfortunately the time scheduled for this monumental effort is limited, so we are asking all gourd artists to submit high-quality photographs of their best works to Lark Books for consideration for the project. The deadline for photo submissions is March 1, 2011. (We have been advised that in the past, some proposed "500" books have had to be cancelled due to lack of submissions!) ### Photography Tips—From Lark Books

Submit only the highest-quality images. Original slides are always preferable to duplicate slides. Transparencies (i.e., larger format film) are preferred over slides for best reproduction quality. If sending digital images, you must carefully follow the guidelines below. All visuals must be clean, sharp images with good contrast. Avoid sending visuals shot at awkward angles, with distracting backgrounds or glare, or unusual colorcasts. A detail is a close-up or an alternate view.

#### **Digital Submission Guidelines - Please Read Carefully**

• Digital photographs should be taken at the camera's highest resolution, at its best quality setting. Do not compress files. Important information may be lost.

• Digital images must have an effective resolution of 300 DPI or higher at the size they will be printed.

Digital images must be a minimum of 4 x 6 inches at 300 DPI.

• We inspect all digital submissions to be sure that resolution has not been altered or enhanced in programs such as Photoshop.

• We inspect all digital submissions for photographic and reprint quality.

• Do not scan and submit printed images. Do not submit images scanned from film.

#### **Data Format Requirements**

#### TIF or JPG Format

TIF files are preferred. JPG files are sometimes acceptable. JPGs are less desirable because data is lost each time a JPG file is saved or resaved. To reduce the amount of data that is lost, select the highest quality setting when saving for the first time, then refrain from resaving file as a JPG. Saving files in TIF format is the best way to completely prevent data loss.

#### **RGB vs CMYK**

Submit digital files in the camera's original RGB format. Do not convert to CMYK: key data will be lost. However, if all you have are CMYK images, do not reconvert them to RGB. Simply note on your submission form that files are CMYK.

#### **RAW Conversion by Professional Photographers**

While unaltered images are preferable, if it is necessary to develop digital negatives (raw files), use Adobe RGB 1998 color space. Save files in TIF format.

#### **Altering Images**

• Adjusting images (color, levels, curves, etc) can cause data loss. Adjustments should only be made by professional photographers that specialize in digital images.

- Do not manipulate the images: Do not "Photoshop."
- Do not silhouette. Do not remove backgrounds or create backgrounds. Do not create shadows.
- Do not rubber stamp or erase any part of image.

#### Naming and Submitting Images

• Name files using the first three letters of your last name, followed by the entry number and extension. example: Tho1.TIF; Tho1a.TIF; Tho2.TIF.

• Do not open files on a computer to rename using the "save" or "save as" commands. Rename files from your desktop.

• Submit files on DVD or CD readable by Macintosh computers. No other storage media will be accepted. Do not use small "mini" DVDs or CDs.

• Write your name and the book title in permanent marker directly on the DVD or CD.

• Include an accurate color printout (at least 4 x 6 inches) of each digital entry you submit, labeled with the file name, title of piece, and entry number.

• When submitting work to be considered for inclusion in a Lark book, a completed entry form must accompany each DVD or CD.
