#### Channel Islands Gourd Society Brings the Bounty Home by Stephanie Staie



Every year the Channel Islands Gourd Society hosts a booth in the Agriculture Building of the Ventura County Fair. This year CIGS members hit a grand slam and produced an award winning booth. Based on the fair theme of "Bounty of the County" members led by Stephanie Staie decided to do a diorama of their county. This included a beautiful panoramic backdrop of the Ventura coastline, Channel Islands and Ventura mountains painted by Cathy Agnew, Luanna Huntsinger and Janie Knappenberger.

Members went to town with their amazing gourd creations. They created a bounty of sea life as jellyfish (Leni Fields), squid (by Cheryl Townsend-which happens to be a multimillion dollar cash crop for Ventura County), a sea lion and

skipjack tuna (Anthony Hepton), a pelican and crab (Charlene Smith), sand dollars (Arline Erickson), crabs (Debbie Guzmann), a sculpin fish (Camille King), dolphins and sea turtles (Elsie Cogswell) starfish and a spiny lobster (Janie Knappenberger). On the shoreline side of the booth, member Judy Aschmann came up with the idea to use the top ten crops of Ventura County to remind people of the agricultural bounty. So members got busy making strawberries, avocadoes, tomatoes, cut flowers, cabbage, peppers, oranges, celery, nursery stock, lemons and raspberries. Karen Hibdon, Pat Barbour, Leni Fields, and Tammy Burt worked hard laying down sand for the ocean side and bark for the shoreline side.

Visitors were amazed when they heard that each crop and sea creature was made entirely from gourds. Karen Hibdon and Sharon Harvey cut up gourd shards for kids to decorate and make necklaces. We also had signs depicting the bounty of gourd varieties and one special sign which talked about the Bounty of Our Hearts. CIGS is not only a fun gourd centered adventure.

We also do multiple outreach projects during the year. CIGS takes the joy of gourd making on the road to such places as the Association for Retarded Citizens, The American Association for University Women, and various Senior Homes in Ventura County. This year was an ambitious undertaking and members went above and beyond and were a joy to work with. As one member said "We make a great team." Apparently we got the message across as we also won the People's Choice Award. Way to go CIGS members!

#### Call to Artists

#### Fourth Annual Northern California Gourd Art Competition – 2012

A Northern CA CGS Gourd Art Competition will take place at Leiser Farms  $10^{th}$  Annual Gourd Festival in Knights Landing, CA May  $19^{th} - 20^{th}$ . It is open to all CGS members throughout the state and beyond.

There are three divisions: Please note: The children's competition will be handled by the local elementary school.

- *The Novice division* is for members who have not previously won a ribbon (Honor system) in a CGS competition.
- *The Open division* is for anyone who has won a ribbon in the novice division or who do not consider themselves a beginner.
- *The Masters division* is for artists who have achieved a level of expertise as demonstrated by having won awards, had work published or sold work in galleries. Artist entering specific categories in the Master's division may not enter the same category in the Open Division, but may enter other Open Division categories.

#### **HOW TO ENTER**

- \* The entry fee is \$6.00 for each entry. **Make checks payable to CGS**. Advance registration is not taken.
- \* All work must be original and done by the exhibiting artist and not previously entered in any CGS competition. Gourds must predominate and artistry, originality and integrity of design are all important.
- \* Only one piece per category is permitted.
- \* Entries may be submitted on Thursday, May 17<sup>th</sup>, from 12 noon 5 pm or Friday, May 18<sup>th</sup>, 8 am 9 am.
- \* MAILED ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. Details will be in the next issue and at the CGS website in early 2012.
- \* Judging will take place on Friday, May 18<sup>th</sup> and the display will be open for viewing on Saturday and Sunday.
- \* Release and pick up of entries will be from 3-5 pm on Sunday, May 20<sup>th</sup>. All art work not picked up will become the property of CGS.
- \* While every effort is made to provide security of items, Leiser Farms and the California Gourd Society are not responsible for damage or lost items.
- \* It is the responsibility of the artists to place their piece in the correct category. Please read category descriptions carefully.

#### **Open and Novice Divisions—Categories 1-11**

- **Category 1:** Collaborative work gourd –Two or more people that worked on the gourd. It can be any technique you choose and it must have a description of the work for the judges.
- **Category 2:** Gourd art from a class taken or from a book Can be any medium or technique. Also a description card with name of book, teacher or class taken for judges information.
- Category 3: Holiday theme -(4th of July, Easter, Christmas, Halloween etc) any technique can be applied.
- Category 4: Wall art Must be able to hang on wall. Any technique can be applied.
- **Category 5:** Garden art –Anything that you would love to have in your garden such as wind chimes, hanging art, garden stake, etc.
- Category 6: Mix media -(paper, clay, material, wire, etc) you must be able to see some of the gourd.
- Category 7: Utilitarian gourd That will hold food or liquid. Any technique can be applied
- Category 8: Textile (weaving, coiling, pine needles, etc) must be able to see the gourd.
- Category 9: Folk art (Americana, patriotic) any technique can be applied.
- Category 10: Animals -they can be carved, woodburned, painted, constructed in any way necessary.
- \*Category 11: Inspired by Larry McClelland- create a single piece of one or more gourds which reflects the whimsy, color and creativity that characterize Larry's work. \*This category only will be judged and awards given by Greg and Mary Leiser.

#### Masters Division Categories 1-10 above or what you choose to do. You must be able to see some of the gourd.

<u>Please note:</u> Artist entering specific categories in the Master's division may not enter the same category in the Open Division, but may enter other Open Division categories.







How can the Board better communicate with the general membership



I met Leslie Caviglia, Visalia's Deputy City Manager, a week or so later. She expressed interest in the gourd. I e-mailed her yesterday to see if the interest was still there before I took it to the next 6 shows I have scheduled this fall. She wrote back that she had gotten approval. On further questioning, I learned the City of Visalia was sending an art piece to its sister city of

Putignano, Italy, and my piece was the "chosen one". Needless to say I am thrilled.

Two days later, Leslie came to me and said she couldn't part with the gourd, so she paid me for it and the city is buying another one of my flowers to give to Italy.




#### Gourdstock 2011
