

In Memory of Larry "MAC" MacClelland

Our dear Larry Mac passed away February 7, 2010. Larry had been sick for a long time.

Larry was a native Californian, having resided in Southern California all his life. He received his Bachelor Degree and did graduate study in art at UCLA, specializing in painting.

Gourds became his media of choice in 1994, and he felt "Gourds offer an endless variety of subject matter and expression." One of Larry's specialties was his whimsical "critters" that included birds, cows, giraffes, ant eaters, armadillos, turtles and quail. He also did fantasy creatures and whimsical people as well. His "Queen Bea" has been a big favorite at the festivals. Another signature of Larry's was his dot painting technique, influenced by Australian Aboriginal art.

This technique was a favorite among people who took his classes on dotted gourds. He also created Southwestern themes, influenced by Anasazi and Mimbres pottery.

Larry was the winner of multiple awards and ribbons for his art, including awards from the California Gourd Society competition at the

Welburn Festival in Fallbrook, as well as the Arizona Gourd Society at Casa Grande, and the Art and Cultural Center

in Fallbrook.

A remembrance and display of Larry and his work will be featured at the Leiser 2010 Festival; Leiser Farms will offer a special award at their 2010 Northern California CGS Art Competition for selection of a gourd artist who best represents Larry's style of whimsy, color and creativity. A remembrance and display of Larry's work is also being planned for the 2010 Welburn Festival as well as a special award during the competition.

Larry's work is featured in Ginger Summit and Jim Widess' book, entitled "Making Gourd Dolls and Spirit Figures".

Before Larry's passing the California Gourd Society had originally planned to honor his retirement in this issue of the Golden Gourd. I have included some of the pictures and stories received. We will have more on display at the "Celebration of Larry's Life".

Judy and Larry Cunningham and others are planning to have a "Celebration of His Life" sometime this spring. This will most likely take place in Southern California.



A Gift to CGS from the Larry D. McClelland Trust

As many of you know already, in February the gourd community lost one of its dear members, Larry McClelland. The California Gourd Society and its members meant a great deal to Mac. As a final gesture to CGS Mac made a bequest of some of his estate. Early in March Jill Walker, Betsy Roberts and Judy Cunningham met at Larry's home to begin taking possession of raw gourds, gourd art, art supplies and tools as well as art related books. Whole and cut gourds as well as partially completed projects were bagged. Art materials were sorted and boxed. Larry's art and his collection of other artist's work were carefully photographed, cataloged and packed. Some 29 bags of raw gourds were distributed to patches throughout the state. Some gourds were also reserved for use at the Patch Leader meeting. Most of the 185 pieces of art and boxes of books were transported to Knights Landing to be stored by Greg and Mary Leiser to be sold for the benefit of CGS in the coming months. The art supplies were broken into 6 lots of 2 boxes each and given to groups that do gourd out reach projects of various types. We will be displaying some of Larry's art and offering some of it for sale at three up-coming events: April 17-18 in Visalia at the Baskets and Gourds, Containers of Our Culture III Conference; May 15-16 in Knights Landing at the Leiser Farms Gourd Festival; and June 26-27 in Fallbrook at the Welburn Farms Gourd Festival. We have already had inquiries from people interested in purchasing pieces from the collection so act promptly when pieces become available. We hope to have a portfolio of photos of the art work available by the April Patch Leader meeting in Visalia. The Board is still discussing how to sell the remainder of the bequest but rest assured we will keep you informed.




MAC

It's hard to believe that 9 years have past since I wrote about Larry MacClelland. A dear friend and admired artist, Mac has been an ongoing part of my life since this piece was written. First as a "patch mate" where his continual streams of new ideas and inspirations encouraged other artists to try new techniques and styles (never to Mac's level....but hey, inspiration is good!), then as a patch leader where Mac's wicked sense of humor and relentlessly good taste in food provoked a whole renaissance in the Pasadena cum GALA (Gourd Artists of Los Angeles) group. Continue onto the board of the California

Gourd Society, where we had some riotously good road trips and some utterly delightful times together. While Mac often speaks with tongue in cheek, he rarely actually bites his tongue and hence his pithy comments and asides sparkle up some famously dull (or less than sterling) moments. Mac's contributions to board meetings, judging activities and the occasional group meeting are often repeated to those not in attendance.

As Mac steps down as the long-term leader of the GALA Patch and the board of the California Gourd Society, we all wish to thank him for his many, many contributions to the gourd world and to the California Gourd Society in specific. Mac's iconic and colorful animals sparkle up the homes of thousands of gourd lovers. His elegant and aristocratic quails speak eloquently of many hours of skilled and expert painting. Mac's use of the warty gourds to create his whimsically magical creatures has spurred the use of these gourds and taken them from where they had previously languished in cornucopias and dry centerpieces to winning prizes in fine art competi-



tions. Mac's innovative use of shells and crystals, fossils and gemstones has spawned multitudes of new gourd artists aspiring to the perfection he has imbued into his work.

As for competitions, after winning nearly every fine art award in the Western Hemisphere (and some for multiple times), Mac has supported the development of young and developing gourd artists through his patronage of the California Gourd Society's annual competition. Mac has helped to create the categories, the rigor and the excitement that put California's competitions into the foreground of the national gourd scene. It is impossible to overstate his influence in this arena.

And those are just the things that most people know about Mac. There is also Mac the gardener, a skilled grower of orchids, Mac the folk art collector with a magnificent collection of Oaxacan alebrijes and Mac the fine chef whose recipes are notorious for fattening his friends (think crab dip)! But as fine an artist as Larry Mac is, and as fine a gardener, chef, singer and creator as he is, Larry MacClelland's most outstanding characteristic is that he is a superb and steadfast friend. I count myself as very lucky to know him and to have my life enriched by his friendship, his clever humor and his art.

Featured Artist Betty Finch

She traveled to Indiana to learn the art of gourd manipulation from master gourd trainer, the late Jim Story. Her quest to learn from the best then took her to China where Mr. Zhang Cairi showed her the art of growing gourds in molds. Combining her avid interest in nature and gourds with FBI National Academy forensic artist training in facial reconstruction, Betty Finch, brings gourds to life with her delightfully whimsical gourd people and animals. GROWERS DIVISION DE-MYSTIFIED

This year we have a "Growers' Division" open to our members in the 2010 Gourd Art Competition held at the Welburn Farm's 14th Annual Gourd Art Festival in June. Our competition offers 10 categories for raw gourds. All gourds submitted must be grown by the competitor and be from last year's crop. Gourds should be well cleaned with the skin removed and the surface left natural. Stems are not required but when present they should be washed, with skin and dirt removed from crevices and the end trimmed.

This Division will be judged according to the criteria in the current American Gourd Society judging standards.

There are four points on which entries are judged:

Point 1. "Cultural perfection, quality, cleanliness and maturity."

For example judges would look for evidence of insect damage, examine the cleanliness, and look at the shape of the gourd.

Point 2. "Trueness of type and color."

For example is the gourd typical for the variety or type.

Point 3. "Size"

In the case of categories which call for measurement, judges will use the measuring procedures outlined in the AGS Judging hand-book.

Point 4. "In the case of matching competition," the scoring points 1-3 will apply.

If, for example, the category is "three identical gourds" the first points (cultural perfection...) will reflect the degree to which the gourds are identical.

The one category that will be judged by a different standard will be category 9. "Hand-Trained". The winner of this category will be eligible to be submitted to the American Gourd Society Jim Story Award 2010. The competition is open to gourd growers at all levels. All entries should be from the previous year's crop- e.g. 2009 growing season. Gourds can be "trained" in a variety of ways, knotted, tied, scarified, or molded. If you have other questions you can get answers at jimstoryaward@aol.com.

We have many enthusiastic gourd growers among our membership so I hope you will enter some of your gourds. I know other members and the public will enjoy seeing some of the beauties you have raised. Also try growing some this year for the 2011 "Growers' Division"

Call To Artists

2nd Annual Northern California Gourd Art Competition - 2010

A Northern CA CGS Gourd Art Competition will take place at Leiser Farms 8th Annual Gourd Festival in Knights Landing, California May 15th and 16th. It is open to all CGS members throughout the state and beyond.

There are two divisions: Please note: A childrens competition will be handled by the local elementary school.

- 1. The Novice division is for members who have not previously won a ribbon (Honor system) in a CGS competition.
- 2. The *Open division* is for anyone who has won a ribbon in the novice division or who do not consider themselves a beginner.

How to enter: Entry Form is on page 23.

- There is an entry fee of \$6.00, payable at the time art is delivered. Make checks payable to CGS.
- All work must be original and done by the exhibiting artist and not previously entered in any CGS competition.

 Gourds must predominate and artistry, originality and integrity of design are all important.
- Only one piece per category is permitted.
- Entries may be submitted on Thursday, May 13, from 12 noon 5 p.m. or Friday, May 14, 8 a.m. 9 a.m. NO mailed entries will be accepted.
- Judging will take place on Friday, May 14th and the display will be open for viewing on Saturday and Sunday.
- Release and pick up of entries will be from 3-5 p.m. on Sunday, May 16th. All art work not picked up will become the property of CGS.
- While every effort is made to provide security of items, Leiser Farms and the California Gourd Society are not responsible for damage or lost items.
- It is the responsibility of the artists to place their piece in the correct category. Please read category descriptions carefully.

CATEGORIES: *Category 11: Inspired by Larry McClelland is a newly added.

- Category 1: Totem. Three or more gourds combined vertically to depict a totem pole.
- Category 2: California Poppy. Any representation of this California symbol. Painting, carving, pyrography, etc. acceptable.
- Category 3: Pyrography. whole or cut gourd. Color may be added but wood burning must predominate.
- Category 4: Signage. Whole or cut gourd but work must include words or message, Any technique acceptable.
- Category 5: Rainstick. Use one or more gourds to create a rainstick. Must be playable and the "rain sound" will be judged.
- Category 6: Shadow Box Must be able to be hung. Create a message or scene using gourds and other materials.
- Category 7: Landscape. Whole or cut gourd, may be inside or outside the gourd. Two or three dimension depiction permitted.
- Category 8: Collaborative work of gourd art. Work with one or more other person to produce a unified work. Team work must be evident in a note describing how each team member participated.
- Category 9: Gourd basket. Must have a handle. May incorporate weaving or coiling of natural or man-made materials.
- Category 10: People. Create a piece with 2 or more figures on a gourd or standing but unified in some way.
- *Category 11: Inspired by Larry McClelland Create a single piece of one or more gourds which reflects the whimsy, color and creativity that are characterize Larry's work.

14th Annual

2010 California Gourd Art Competition

The intent of the Gourd Art Competition is to encourage artists to meet the challenge of creating a gourd piece which fulfils the requirements of a show category.

Thousands of visitors attend the exhibit held each year at the Welburn Gourd Farm and enjoy the creativity and skill of CGS members. If requested, individual artist's telephone number may be released by CGS so that visitors may contact the artist after the show. 2010 California Gourd Art Competition Rules:

Any individual may enter. All entrants must be current members of the California Gourd Society.

GOURDS MUST PREDOMINATE – artistry, originality and integrity of design are considered.

Participants may enter the Growers' and one other division, only one piece per category.

There are six divisions:

The Novice division is for members who have not previously won a ribbon in the CGS competition.

The Open division is for anyone who has won a ribbon in the novice division or who do not consider themselves a beginner (honor system).

The Masters' division – this division includes artists who have achieved a level of expertise as demonstrated by having won awards, had work published or sold work in galleries. Artists entering in this division my not submit entries in the Novice or Open divisions.

The Children Division—12 years old and Under

The Youth Division - ages 13-17

The Growers' Division

The entry fee is \$6.00 for each entry, the Entry Form is on page 23. **Make checks payable to CGS**, There is no charge for children and youth.

All work must be original and be done by the exhibiting artist and not previously entered in any CGS competition.

Advanced registration is NOT taken. When mailing entries, please include a completed form for each entry as well as the \$6.00 entry fee and return postage if needed.

Deadline: Mailed entries must be postmarked no later than Monday, June 21st. Personal deliveries may be delivered ONLY on Thursday, June 24th from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE JUDGED!

Judging will be on Thursday and Friday, June 24 and 25. All participants agree to allow photographs to be taken of displayed items.

Pick-up will be Sunday, June 27 from 3:00 - 5:00 p.m. Entries may not be removed early. Mailed entries will be returned within two weeks after the show. **Mailed entries must have return postage and self addressed shipping container with a label.** All art work not picked up or arranged for pre-paid return will be donated to CGS.

Judging: The California Gourd Society will coordinate all judging. Judges have been trained and will follow the American Gourd Society judging guidelines.

While every effort is made to provide security for your items, the Welburn Gourd Farm and the California Gourd Society are not responsible for damaged or lost items.

2010 Open and Novice Divisions—Categories 1-21

Please note *Category 21: Inspired by Larry McClelland is a newly added category and is open to all divisions.

- Hand Carving Carving on the surface of the gourd. It may be chipped, gouged or chiseled. Other media/embellishments may be used.
- gourd. Other media/embellishments permitted.
- 3. A to Z Choose a letter of the alphabet and use it as an inspiration to decorate a whole or cut gourd.
- 4. Inlay Inlay must be the focal point but other techniques and media may be used.
- 5. Reduce, Reuse, Recycle Incorporate any recycled a woven lid made of item(s) to enhance the design of a gourd
- 6. Miniature May be any subject but may not exceed 3 inches in any direction.
- example, a purse, hat, or jewelry

Masters Division-Categories 1-4

- 1. Inlay Inlay of any material must be a focal point Power Carving - Carving on the surface of the but other media and techniques may be employed.
 - 2. Indigenous Peoples Create a gourd reflective of the style or culture of any indigenous people anywhere in the world.
 - 3. Basketry Created a closed vessel which features
 - by some basketry technique. Any natural or man-made fiber permitted.
- 4. Size Matters Create a gourd work that is at least 7. Wearable Gourd Accessory - any wearable item, for 24 inches tall. Any subject, technique or medium permitted
- 8. Team Work Create a gourd piece with one or more other CGS members. One or multiple gourds and any media can be used.
- 9. Decorated, Long or Short Handled Dipper gourd Use a single gourd, whole or cut.
- 10. Mask Any type. Eyes may be cut or not cut out. Must be fitted with a hanger for display.
- 11. Dolls and Figures Create a single piece featuring 2 or more figures using one or multiple gourds. Figures should be unified in some way. For example mounted on a base.
- 12. Painting Use any paint medium on a single whole or cut gourd. Other techniques such as carving or pyrography not permitted.
- 13. Pyrography A single, un-cut gourd featuring wood burning. Coloring may be used.
- 14. Clay Use any type of clay (e.g. polymer, paper, self-hardening, ceramic, etc) to create texture, relief or design on a single gourd.
- 15. Indigenous peoples of the world- Create a gourd reflective of the style or culture of any indigenous people anywhere in the world.
- 16. "Red" Create a piece featuring the color red. Any subject or medium acceptable. One or multiple gourds may be used.
- 17. The Gilded Gourd create a gourd using a metallic sheen as a major feature or focal point.
- 18. Utilitarian gourd object May use more than one gourd but must be of practical use.
- 19. "Down 'n Dirty" Use the natural/uncleaned gourd skin to enhance your design on a single gourd.
- 20. Closed coil basketry Use closed coil basketry on the rim of a gourd as a feature/ focal point . Other decoration to the gourd permitted.
- *21. "Inspired by the art of Larry McClelland" -In honor of our recent loss of this very active CGS member and art competition competitor, Larry McClelland, this special category is added to the 2010 California Gourd Society Gourd Art Competition. Entries should reflect the kind of whimsy, color, imaginative use of gourd forms and creativity that characterize Larry's work.

(Entries should be created by the artist with minimal adult assistance.)

- 1. Animal Create a gourd animal. (Be sure your animal can stand up for display.) Your animal may be real or imaginary.
- 2. My Idea Create something that is useful or decorative. May be one or more gourds. Any technique allowed. Use your imagination!

Youth 13-17—Categories 1-3 Should be the work of the entrant only

- 1. Wood burning Use a single gourd. May be cut. Color may be added.
- 2. Beads Use any kind of beads to decorate a gourd. Gourd may also be painted or stained.
- 3. My Idea Create something that is useful or decorative. May be one or more gourds. Any technique allowed. Use your imagination!

Growers Division - Categories 1-10

Note: Gourds submitted in these 10 categories must have been grown by the exhibitor/ entrant. Gourds should be well cleaned and the surface left natural. They must be from last year's crop. Stems are not required but when present they should be washed, with skin and dirt removed from crevices and the end trimmed. Judging of categories

- 1- 7: 50% Cultural perfection, quality, cleanliness, and maturity; 50% Trueness to type/variety.
- 1. Hard-shelled / Lagenaria Group of three different varieties
- 2. Ornamentals Group of three different varieties.
- 3. Three of a kind Any variety. Will be judged for uniformity of size color, and shape.
- 4. Largest Gourd Gourd with largest circumference
- 5. Smallest Gourd Smallest mature gourd.
- 6. Longest Gourd Measured from stem to blossom end.
- 7. Longest Straight gourd. Measured by straight line between extreme points of the gourd.
- Judging of Class 8 9: 20% Quality, cleanliness; 80% Unusualness, bizarreness, and or contortedness
- 8. Most unusual The most unusual, bizarre , or contorted gourd due to natural phenomenon.
- 9. Hand-Trained May be tied, molded or manipulated in any way. Winner of this category will be eligible to be submitted to the American Gourd Society **Jim Story Award 2010**. This competition is open to gourd growers at all levels. The award has been named in memory and in honor of Jim Story, master gourd manipulator.
- Judging of Class 10: 50% Cultural perfection, cleanliness, and maturity; 50% Attractiveness of arrangement.
- 10. Gourd Display Arrange a grouping of gourds (minimum of 5) in a basket or bowl or free-standing.

To me, Larry is an innovative artist. His sculptures have always been amazingly beautiful. He knows how to stretch his imagination to the fullest.





Highlights of the CALIFORNIA GOURD SOCIETY Board of Directors Meeting January 16 and 17, 2010

The annual meeting of the California Gourd Society Board of Directors was called to order at 9:25am at the home of President Walker in Watsonville, CA.

Treasurer's Report: The financial statements were reviewed, reporting income of \$9,856 and expenses of \$9,345 in 2009. A motion was made and carried to investigate putting some of the CGS reserve funds into a higher interest bearing account.

Membership Report: The current membership level was 437, reflecting a decrease of 159 over last year. A motion was made and carried to transition from the staggered monthly member renewal process to a calendar year process as follows:

January-April 2010 members will pay \$20 and be due for renewal January 1, 2011

May-June 2010 members will pay \$30 and be due for renewal January 1, 2012

September-December 2010 members will pay \$20 and be due for renewal January 1, 2012

Future new members joining after September 1 will pay \$20 and be due for renewal January 1 of the second year (will receive up to a 16-month membership).

A motion was made and carried that the Board and Patch Leaders actively seek a person to handle membership card distribution and that a coupon in a new format be created using a punch card system.

Newsletter Report

The continuing need for newsletter articles was discussed. A motion was made and carried to adopt new advertising rates retroactive to the inception of the electronic newsletter as follows: \$50 full page (was \$120); \$25 half page (was \$75); \$15 3"x3" (was \$35); \$5 business card (was \$15). To avoid the Golden Gourd becoming several pages of advertising, full-page ads will only be offered to festival sponsors. It was disclosed that Mary Bliss receives \$500 payment for the publication of each issue of the Golden Gourd, an amount formerly paid to a contractor.

Webmistress Report

Ways to keep the website up to date were discussed and Webmistress Lisa Toth will take many of the suggestions and incorporate them into our site. She reported that on-line tutorials helped her to redesign the site. A motion was made and carried to reimburse her the cost for the tutorial subscription for another year so that she could further improve our website. A motion was made and carried to renew the www.calgorud.com web domain name for another five years.

Regional Patch and Program Report: Discussion took place regarding the 2009 patch leader meeting at JoAnn Clark's home and plans for the 2010 meeting at Toni Best's home in Visalia. The group reviewed a list of patches and efforts to keep this updated on the website and in the CGS membership brochure will be undertaken. Betsy was pleased to report that Rebecca Stark volunteered to fill the vacant Northern California patch coordinator post.

Old Business: Mini-Mask Project. A status report was given on the mini-gourd mask fund raising project being coordinated by Kay Miyamoto, Niki Zaragoza and Kris Mangliers. 115+ masked have been received, some without a hanger and 5 were over the maximum size. Until the appropriate shadow boxes are found, we won't know how many items will be raffled off on April 17, 2010. It was noted that we should be thinking about our next fund raiser project.

It will be available for use for CGS slide shows and storage of photos and other historical documents. During a discussion about the loss of our credit card slider in a fire, the group agreed to investigate the feasibility of Paypal as an option for on-line membership payments.

After these changes are made and final review takes place, the program will be ready to roll out. New Business: Board Officers. A motion was made and carried to move the schedule for the beginning and ending of the President's term of office to coincide with the annual Board of Directors' meeting instead of June and to create officer positions for Immediate Past President and First Vice President. The two candidates for President, Cecile Garrison Sylvia Nelson, said a few words before the Board considered their appointment. After they left the room and discussion took place, a motion was made that, based on the populace vote, to appoint Sylvia Nelson the President of the California Gourd Society effective January 17, 2010. Cecile Garrison was invited to serve as First Vice President of the CGS. The need to fill the Director at Large position vacated by Larry McClelland was discussed. CGS Members Event. CGS reserve funds would be used to offset expenses for this event. A motion was made and carried to authorize up to \$600 of reimbursed expenses for Sylvia Nelson to attend the AGS board meeting. It was agreed to direct the Treasurer to continue sending \$20 to AGS to cover Jim Story Award expenses.

Other business. Sylvia Nelson said she was thrilled and proud to be a part of this group. Jill said she was very gratified to serve as President of CGS. Betsy said that Jill was amazing and consistently went "above and beyond the call of duty." Jill distributed gourd pins to board members as a token of her appreciation.

The meeting adjourned at 5:44pm.

President Sylvia Nelson called a supplemental meeting of the California Gourd Society Board of Directors to order at Noon on Sunday, January 17, 2010 at the home of Jill Walker. It was reported that, after due consideration, Cecile Garrison had declined to be First Vice-President.

Following discussion, a motion was made and carried to authorize a \$25 honorarium to CGS competition judges and a \$15 honorarium to competition clerks. The meeting adjourned 12:10pm.
