Featured Artist Jack Thorp

Jack Thorp discovered gourd art the way many of us do - by default.

While out for a walk in 1997, he happened upon a gallery displaying gourd art from Africa and wandered inside. That day, Jack signed up for the gallery owner's basic gourd class and has been honing his craft ever since.

Jack is a Master Gourd Artist, AGS Certified Judge and AGS Certified Judge Trainer. He learns by experimenting with processes, watching other artists and interviewing people about their techniques. He relies on books, magazines and the Internet to keep abreast of trends.

Jack's favorite piece is a 47-inch-long dipper gourd with fret work, which won Best of Show, Best of Division, People's Choice and Judges Choice at a CGS competition in 2011. This piece reflects his patience and attention to detail.

Jack's art is influenced by 25 years working in floral design and studying under a master florist. Before beginning a project, he contemplates the gourd's shape and sketches out designs. He looks to nature, sculpture and woodcarving for inspiration.

Jack is an institution in the world of gourd art. When he was starting out and seeking information about gourds, he was referred to Carol Rookstool, the founder of CGS, who recruited him to be a founding member of the group. Jack has also been involved in the Orange County Gourd Society Chapter. He first attended the Welburn Festival when it was in the front yard of Doug and Sue Welburn's home in 1998. The next year, he had a booth at the Festival.


Jack's work has been displayed in numerous Los Angeles-area galleries and is published in <u>The Complete Book of</u> <u>Gourd Carving</u> (pictures in this issue on page 4). Jack is known among fellow gourd artists for his willingness to help beginners and share his knowledge of techniques and tools. His favorite tools are his Micro Mark gourd saw, his Detail Master woodburner and his Ram Mystisa portable micro-carver.

Susan Sullivan writes:


I have learned during my 20+ years of "gourding" that "Gourd Friends" are really Good Friends!

But that was never more apparent than when I observed the "Tres Amigos" of the Orange County Gourdpatch. Jack Thorp and Bill Duncan rallied when their patch buddy Russ Conley began to lose mobility as a result of ALS (Lou Gerhig's disease). Jack and Bill continued to drive Russ to our patch meetings and even had a special ramp constructed to allow them to maneuver Russ's wheelchairs into the meetings. They repeatedly rallied Gourders to "Walk for Russ" in the annual events to support ALS research. They were there for Russ and his family all through his experiences dealing with the inevitable progression of his illness.

After Russ passed, Jack and Bill helped publish detailed tutorials and conducted workshops to teach the "Russ Conley Rainstick" method. They wanted to assure his superior "toothpick technique" will continue to be taught to new gourd artists, because it creates such a beautiful resonant gourd rainstick and will perpetuate his memory. Yes, Gourd friendships are lasting friendships!

"Spring Chicken"

(Sherry Hunga-Moore)

A whimsical folk art project using repurposed springs and a sculpting medium. Terrific project to complete within a few hours.

Sculpt - Paint - Assemble

- 1. Create comb, beak, wattle and eyes, securely pressing & molding onto gourd, set aside to dry. Ensure googley eyes have a flat surface to adhere to if you are using them. Once clay has dried sand if necessary.
- 2. Glue spring onto wooden plaque.
- 3. Paint base, spring and chicken. Using stylist, create dots for decorative interest.
- 4. Seal entire project with clear sealer.
- 5. Create and secure nest and create raffia bow.
- 6. Attach a black board sign.
- 7. Glue on googley eyes if desired.

Materials - Supplies - Tools



- Small kettle shaped gourd, (*needs to balance easily on top of spring*)
- Bed Spring
- Wooden plaque
- Quick wood or Air dry paper clay
- Raffia or a natural ribbon material





- Sisal material for nest or pre-maid nest
- Paints, brushes, sealer and stylists
- Mini chalkboard signs & chalk
- Googley eyes
- Super glue & sandpaper

Tips & Tricks for Cleaning Gourds

How to remove the most stubborn dried-on skin.

This trick works on even the tough waxy white skin patches. Wrap the gourd in one or two layers of paper towels, dampen them so they cling to the gourd. Place the wrapped gourd inside a plastic bag and tie it shut. Keep it at a comfortable room temperature out of direct sunlight for 3 days. Open the bag, immediately remove the paper towel and dunk the gourd in water and scrub the skin off with a pot scrubber. It is easier to clean if you keep the gourd damp. For the really tough spots scrape the skin off with a non-serrated knife blade. It should scrape off easily. If not, rough up the skin with a pot scrubber, re-wrap the gourd in damp paper towels and tie it in the bag for a few days longer. Caution! If conditions are right mold will grow very quickly inside the bag. It won't hurt the gourd, in fact it will make cleaning much easier. You should wear breathing protection while opening the bag and using this process.

Simple Gourd Washing Machine

This trick works for medium and small sized gourds. You will need 2 buckets. Five gallon size works best. Fill the bottom bucket half-full with warm water. Add gourds, stack the second bucket on top. The gourds will be forced completely under water as the top bucket fills. Let them sit and soak until the skin is soft enough to scrub off. Soaking time varies but most are ready in 30 minutes. You can speed the process by lifting and lowering the top bucket, agitating your washing machine.

Cleaning inside a very long gourd

Here is a tip you can use to remove seeds and pulp from a really long gourd. You must first cut a hole (anyplace) in the gourd that is large enough a seed can not get stuck in the hole. Insert a chain into the hole. Dog chains work well for this. The chain should be heavy enough to knock seeds loose. With the entire chain inside the gourd, tilt it from one end to the other, pull the chain back out and dump out the seeds and material that are loose. re-insert the chain and shake the gourd. Remove the chain and dump the debris. Repeat until clean. Wear breathing protection while performing this operation.






